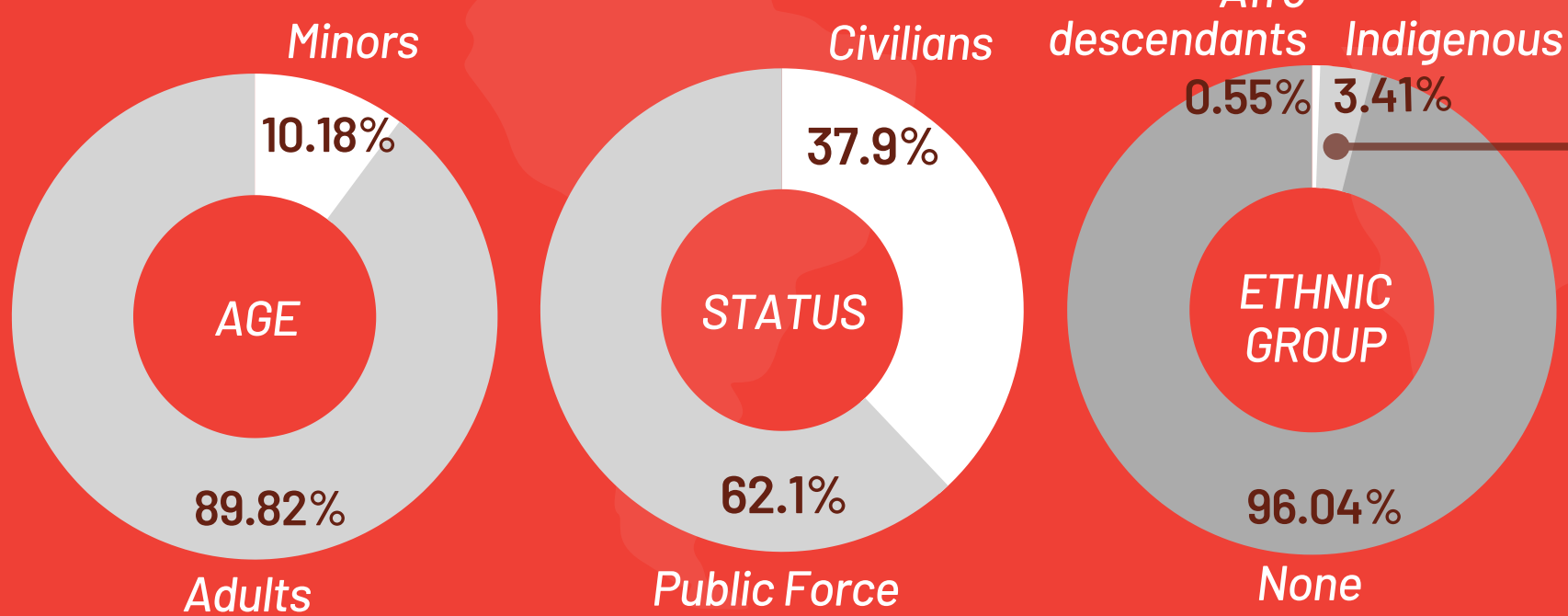

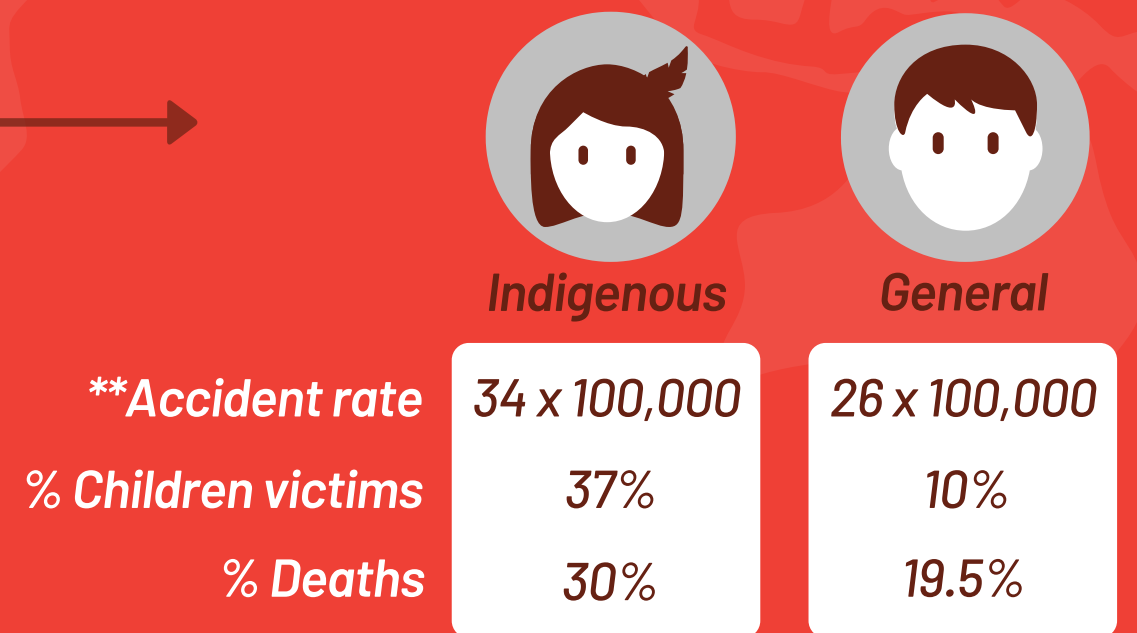

THE WORK OF UNMAS COLOMBIA***



76 victim assistance routes elaborated or updated in the same number of municipalities with technical assistance from UNMAS.



Support for 49 victims of explosive ordnance to access the institutional victim assistance route.



24 local and regional development plans integrated mine action, with technical assistance from UNMAS.



75 former combatants continue to be trained in mine action work as an alternative for socio-economic reintegration.



Webinars on Geographical Information Systems to improve the operational information management capacities of organizations in the sector.
